

School of Management Global Program Virtual Fee Hardship Scholarship Policy

If you have exhausted your access to financial aid resources, you may apply for a financial hardship scholarship for all or part of the School of Management Global Program Virtual Fee.

In reviewing your application, the School of Management will consider your total cost of attendance and other applicable costs against your applicable financial aid resources (exclusive of loans and other debt-related resources).

You must submit the Hardship Scholarship Application every semester for consideration. If you demonstrate financial hardship resulting from the School of Management Global Program Virtual Fee, you may qualify for a hardship scholarship.

To be considered, you must meet all of the following criteria:

- Be a full-time student
- Be eligible to receive federal financial aid
- Apply for federal financial aid and accept all financial aid for which you qualify (not including the federal parent PLUS loan)
- Have exceeded or exhausted all financial aid
- Your total qualified educational expenses (tuition, fees, room and board, and other expenses related to the cost of attendance) are greater than your financial aid package (state and federal supplemental grants or other scholarships)
- The grants, scholarships and other waivers/exemptions you received are less than the total cost of attendance
